Although I agree that the Military Base should have been returned to the natives of Kettle and Stony Point years ago, I cannot agree with the violent and lawless takeover of the base and the violence that erupted during the illegal occupation by these same natives in the Park. No special interest group has the right to break the laws of this province or country to further their own agenda.

I find it difficult to explain the aura of fear and mistrust that has evolved in this community and rules uppermost my daily life. I have endured four years of stress, anxiety and financial burden over the West Upperwash Land claim, which is still not settled and will not be for years to come.
